Why This Scholarship?

Jefferson County Lodge #9 is a part of the world's largest and oldest fraternal organization, Freemasonry. We are a Lodge of men who are dedicated to the development of high moral character in ourselves and our families, and the promotion of such character in our communities, especially in the young men of our communities. Moral and industrious young men of high character are essential to the stability, prosperity, and governance of our families, business and civic organizations, and communities at the local and national levels.

As a fraternal organization, our focus is on men, and thus we have chosen to limit this scholarship to young men.

The amount of the scholarship award is \$3,000.00.

Qualifications for Award

1. The recipient must be a young man whose primary residence is in Wisconsin.
2. The recipient must be graduating from Fort Atkinson High School, Jefferson High School, Johnson Creek High School, Lake Mills High School, or Watertown High School.
3. The recipient must have a commendable academic record with a GPA of at least 3.0.
4. The recipient must have demonstrated substantial service in their community or church.
5. The recipient must initiate college entrance within eight months after being named the recipient.
6. The recipient may start out at a technical school or junior college but must enroll in a college transfer program that would ultimately lead to a baccalaureate degree.
7. Former students are not eligible.
8. Felons are not eligible.
9. The applicant must fully and accurately complete all aspects of the scholarship application.
10. Applications must be received or postmarked no later than March 1st.

3. Two letters of recommendation from those who supervised one or more of your community service activities. Include the name of the community service activity, start and end date, purpose, and supervisor/leader name and phone number.
4. Write an essay not less than 600 words and not more than 1000 words telling us something more about yourself and your life experiences that will help us become acquainted with you as a person and a student, apart from coursework, grades, test scores, and other objective data. Include some discussion of each of the following.
 - a. A background, identity, interest, or talent that is essential to understanding you and how you interact with life as it presents itself.
 - b. Recount an accomplishment or event, formal or informal, significant in your transition from childhood to adulthood within your culture, community, or family.
 - c. Recount an incident or time when you experienced a non-trivial failure. How did it affect you and what did you learn from the experience?
 - d. Reflect upon a time when you provided needed leadership. What prompted you to act? Would you make the same decision again?
 - e. Reflect upon a moral dilemma that challenged you, the decision you made, and why you think that decision says something about your essential character.

5. A headshot (head and shoulders only, not full body) color photograph of you, in JPG format, emailed to JeffersonLodge9@gmail.com. Ensure that your email includes your full name, high school name, and personal telephone contact information. By submitting this photograph you are consenting to its use in perpetuity on Jefferson County Lodge #9 digital platforms (web site, Facebook, etc.), its successors and assigns, and in publications of the Grand Lodge Free and Accepted Masons of Wisconsin.

Presentation at Jefferson County Lodge
